AROUND THE COUNTRYSIDE

From Poggio Renatico, after a quick visit to the village, take via Bosco Salici to the north, going into the ordered countryside, cultivated fields punctuated here and there by farmhouses; after about 5 km the road turns right onto via Raveda and we turn left along this quiet straight road. From via Raveda we reach the SP 50 road and follow that for a short stretch, then turning left onto via Giovecca. At the junction with the SP66 road, turn left to the green Oasi Boscona, where we can stop for lunch or for horse riding. Shortly before the entrance to the right is the access road to the 17th century Villa Sessa. To continue towards Vigarano Mainarda you must turn right onto the cycle path. After 20 metres or so it enters the green Oasi Boscona, where you can stop for lunch or for horse riding. Going back onto the SP66 road, turn right onto the cycle path parallel to the road and continue along the north side of the Nature Reserve; after about a kilometre we will see to the right the access road to the 17th century Villa Sessa flanked by poplars. After the hamlet of Borgo turn left and then quickly to the right when we meet the cycle path. At the junction with via Rondona, we carry straight on along the cycle track of Vigarano Mainarda and continue until the village of Vigarano Pieve. The track goes as far as the railway and then becomes a road for mixed traffic. Carrying on in the direction of the centre, after the cycle underpass, we reach the junction with the via Mantova (SP69). Turn right and then left into via XXV Aprile, then at the crossroads left into via Aldo Moro. The road is immersed once again in nature, arriving after about half a kilometre at the cycle path that runs along the bank of the Burana canal.
